


Article 13 vs memes & mash-ups

WHAT'S A MEME?

Memes are typically humorous images, videos or excerpts of texts which are copied and spread rapidly by Internet users, often with (slight) variations.



Would Article 13 affect the creation and use of memes?



Most memes can be used freely as they are covered by exceptions to copyright.

parody, citation, short extracts, quotes, excerpts, clipping etc.

Article 13 won't change this.


So what is all this hype around Article 13?

Article 13 only applies to certain platforms and not the whole internet.

There is no obligation or prohibition whatsoever on the consumer!




Moreover, the licenses given to platforms will cover the acts of uploaders too

So consumers






rightsholders to ensure infringing works are not available on their services

The platforms need to cooperate with


whilst non-infringing works such as memes must remain available.
